The annual migratory pattern of these magnificent animals has begun again and what has been apparent of recent years has been their frequent appearance in good numbers.

For those who have an interest, the website www.visitgreatoceanroad. org.au has a comprehensive Whale sightings section logging the time, date and location of all sightings along the Great Ocean Road corridor. For the real enthusiasts, you can also subscribe to the "Whale Sighting Alert" and receive updates via email whenever there is a Whale sighting on the coast.

Committee for Lorne members have been busy representing the town in working with the Great Ocean Road Coast Committee and their consultants as they finalise their Investment Logic Mapping as part of the preparation of the Business Case for future funding for the development of the Point Grey precinct. The consultants have a difficult task in presenting a "commercial case" for obtaining Government Funding for the site. I look forward to reporting the recommendations as they are developed.

NEW MASTER PLAN FOR STRIBLING RESERVE

Recently the Shire initiated a project to develop a new, updated Master Plan for Stribling Reserve, Lorne. It is over 14 years since the last Master Plan was produced. Since its construction in the late 80s, the Stribling Reserve Leisure Centre has been a core asset for the community of Lorne.

There is an incredible variety of uses for the Reserve, including indoor and outdoor sports, exercise classes, use of the commercial kitchen and Medevac by helicopter to name a few. The current facilities at Stribling Reserve include the oval, cricket pitch, netball court, indoor stadium, multi-purpose room and the Men's Shed

There has been significant growth in the demand to use these facilities. The Lorne Football & Netball Club now fields four football teams and six netball teams. This demand, together with the extensive use of facilities by the Lorne-Aireys Inlet P-12 College, has highlighted that there are some deficiencies in the current facilities.

The process to develop the Master Plan will be to identify the gaps between current facilities and anticipated needs and to identify what other features and facilities need to be considered to ensure that Stribling Reserve remains a vital component of community infrastructure well into the future. The new Master will be the "roadmap" for Stribling Reserve for the next 15-20 years. Stribling Reserve is a major community asset and we wish it to continue to be so.

The project is being run in true partnership between the community and the Surf Coast Shire Council. For instance, the Committee for Lorne is the Project Owner and the Shire is the Project Sponsor. This is a collaborative partnership to ensure that what is planned for Stribling Reserve is a true reflection of the community's aspirations.

There will be extensive consultation with all user groups and with the community in general. In the coming weeks, we will inform you of the ways in which you can participate. We want to ensure that as many members of the Lorne Community as possible have the opportunity to provide input to the Master Planning process. We are also looking for your innovative ideas as to the type activities that could be supported within Stribling Reserve which are not currently available; exercise circuit, gym, meeting rooms etc. to name a few.
