On Sunday last the Committee for Lorne, in partnership with the Surf Coast Shire, hosted the first Stribling Reserve Master Plan Community Workshop. After months of preliminary work, preparation and appointments of consultants the community discussions and requests for input are now well underway. The opening session focused on background to the project, current usage and the likely future needs.

With just under thirty in attendance, participants were encouraged to "think outside the square" in what the future of the Reserve may look like and to whom it may cater for. Those in attendance included a cross section of existing user groups of the Reserve, adjoining property owners, interested community members and the Project Control Group.

It was a very productive session that produced a number of innovative ideas for consideration by the consultants in their master planning process. The common thread of all was the need to ensure the green open space of the Reserve was preserved for future generations. Now less than two weeks until the curtain comes up on Lorne's Festival of the Performing Arts and to see the opening night gala as a sell out really sets the scene for what is shaping as the best yet.
