Whilst on achievements, it can't unrecognised that the GMHBA Lorne Pier to Pub Lorne Mountain to Surf has won the Arthur J. Gallagher award for the Australian community sporting event of the year. Having just completed its 37th year, the Lorne Pier to Pub is the largest open water swim in the world and it is organised and run entirely by volunteers from the Lorne Surf Life Saving Club.

The race attracts up to 5,000 competitors and, in 1988, it entered the Guinness Book of Records when 3,071 swimmers took part and made it the world's largest open water swim. The GMHBA Lorne Pier to Pub swim attracts swimmers from all ages and from all levels.

Don't forget to get up to Stribling Reserve this weekend to support the Lorne Football and Netball Club in their huge Easter Blockbuster against Birregurra for the Mark Trickey Memorial Cup. Both our netball and football teams are off to an excellent start and are looking to consolidate on their early season form. It will be a huge weekend for the Club, kicking off with the popular Thursday evening "Club meals" at 6.30pm. Easter Saturday will be a great day and there is the expectation of a huge crowd with Mike Brady performing pre-game from 1.30pm.

REPORT CARD — LORNE BOWLS CLUB TO THE COMMUNITY

The Lorne Bowls Club is in the mid-term of its five year strategic plan. I am pleased to report our progress to the Lorne community. The following things have been achieved:

- We have formed a second Saturday pennant side.
- We achieved on-field success by finishing on top of the division 2 competition, after only one year at that level.
- We have doubled the number of members available for pennant selection.
- We have made barefoot bowling a sustainable activity and fundraiser for the Club in a way that minimises the pressure on members to be involved in the holiday season.
- We have gained two major sponsors for the Club, namely Great Ocean Road Real Estate and the Bendigo Community Bank.
- We have obtained funding and the necessary permissions to take a planning proposal to the Surf Coast Shire for the installation of lights for the green.
- We have attracted younger players to play pennant.
- The Club rooms have been used more by community groups for meetings and the green for social bowling.
- We have an increase of three percent in our total membership, currently sitting at 214.
- The restaurant and bar is operating in a sustainable way, whilst allowing the facility to be used for its primary function, bowling.

Our success in reaching the division 2 grand-final, after only one year at this level, was an outstanding achievement. I must acknowledge that emotions are still very raw after the narrow loss to Cressy. However, we must not lose sight of the fact that the team had a sensational season, finishing on top of the ladder with only two defeats for the home and away season. The comeback staged by the players, after being 33 shots down at afternoon tea, was exciting and a testimony to their spirit and skill. Although disappointed, the spirit at the Club on Saturday night was warm and positive about the new season. Thank you to the many supporters who attended the grand final and encouraged the side. The conditions were not pleasant, but the warmth and strength of the support was greatly appreciated by the



The achievements listed above give the Club a solid platform for future sustainability. The installation of lights will expand bowling opportunities for members and the community. Naturally, we were required to negotiate guidelines for the use of the lights with Mantra. The lights can be used until 9.00pm, with special extensions negotiated with the Mantra management. This agreement will be reviewed after the first twelve months. The Club received a grant of \$20,000 from the Commonwealth Government, under The Stronger Communities Programme. This funding must be matched by the Club and from our successful year of trading, we are able to meet this obligation.

This year's season was a long one, and I thank the more than sixty members who played pennant in the four teams during the season. There is one area that we must try to address in the short-term, and that is the number of women playing pennant and social bowls. We are starting a "try-bowls program", starting on Thursday, April 20 at 1.00pm, inviting any women in the community who would like to bowl in a non-competitive environment. Please just turn-up, we will provide the bowls and the welcome.
